C: EVENT 19.30 – 21.00	Richard Berengarten	On the first evening of the conference, internationally acclaimed poet Richard Berengarten will talk about and read from his latest volume of poems <i>Changing</i> , a monumental 450-poem homage to the Chinese divinatory and philosophical text, the <i>I Ching</i> . <i>Changing</i> was described by the Fortnightly Review as “a culmination of Berengarten’s career. His vision of the world is holistic, as is the vision of the world on which the <i>I Ching</i> is founded. Everything meshes seamlessly together – including thought and words – into an organic continuum”	His <i>Selected Writings</i> number nine volumes; his writing has been translated into over 100 languages; the <i>Critical Companion to his works</i> contains 34 essays from contributors in 11 countries; and his many awards include prizes in the UK, Serbia, and Macedonia. Formerly Visiting Professor at Notre Dame University (1982), British Council Lector in Belgrade (1987-1990), Royal Literary Fund Fellow, Newnham College, Cambridge (2003- 2005), Berengarten is a Fellow of the English Association, Bye-Fellow at Downing College, Cambridge, and poetry editor of <i>Jewish Quarterly</i> .
